Subject: Denemarken: Iran's ambassador demands 'terror exiles' be handed over

Iran's ambassador to Denmark, Mr Morteza Moradian, has called for an 'unknown number' of Iranian exiles in Denmark, who according to the Tehran authorities played a key role in Saturday's terror attack, be handed over to face prosecution in his own country.

In an interview with TV2 the Ambassador said terrorism is a problem throughout the world and all countries need to help each other. "Double standards on this issue are unacceptable," he said, adding that Iran has repeatedly provided Denmark with evidence.

"Two days ago we informed the Ministry of Justice we want the perpetrators extradited, something we first requested in 2010," he said, but welcomed Foreign Minister Anders Samulsen's warning of 'serious repercussions if the perpetrators are linked to Denmark as a 'step in the right direction'."

Prime Minister Lars Løkke Rasmussen also weighed in yesterday, saying that if Iran can provide evidence that people in Denmark have been involved in the planning or execution of a terrorist attack there will be a 'definite' response.

Ambassador Moradian declined to say whether he expected Iranian exiles to be extradited but expressed hope that the 'Danish authorities will do their best'.

Iran summons Denmark's ambassador for dressing-down after terrorist attack

Denmark's ambassador to Iran, Danny Annan, and envoys from the Netherlands and UK were summoned to appear before Teheran's cleric regime, Saturday, after terrorists with alleged links to all three countries carried out an attack on an army parade which killed at least 29 people near the Iraqi border.

The Danish and Dutch ambassadors, alongside the British charge d'affaires, were 'informed of Iran's strong protests over their respective countries' hosting of some members of the terrorist group' which carried out the attack.

Local news agency IRNA reported that foreign ministry spokesman Bahram Qasemi called on Denmark and the Netherlands to extradite the attack's 'perpetrators and their accomplices' to stand trial in Iran. It was also reported that the Danish and Dutch diplomats were told Iran had 'previously warned' their governments about harbouring Arab separatists.

Mr Annan confirmed to TV2 News that he had attended the meeting but declined to add more.

Saturday's attack in Ahvaz killed at least 25 people and wounded over 60 in the deadliest terror atrocity to strike Iran in nearly a decade. The al-Ahvaziya terror group, allegedly backed by Saudi Arabia, is believed to have recruits scattered in several European countries, including the Netherlands and in Denmark, claimed responsibility.

Foreign Minister: 'Serious repercussions' if Iran attack has links to Denmark

Foreign Minister Anders Samuelsen condemned the terrorist attack on the army parade in

Ahvaz, Iran, and warned there would be 'serious repercussions' if it's proved the perpetrators are linked to Denmark, as claimed by the Iranian authorities. In a texted response to TV2 News he said:

"Let there be no doubt that Denmark denounces terrorist attacks no matter where they take place in the world. The Iranians claim that those responsible for the Ahvaz attack have active members in this country and if that's proved to be correct we will come down very hard on them."

According to TV2 News, Yacoub al-Tostari, the spokesman for the Arab Struggle Movement for the Liberation of Ahwaz (ASMLA) that Iran claims carried out the attack, resides in Denmark and is enrolled at Copenhagen University. He told TV2 News that it was the Ahvaz National Resistance, a splinter group of ASMLA, that accepted responsibility.

Yacoub al-Tostari is an alias but his real name is known to TV2.
